

Cold and Flu Season Ahead

How serious is the flu?

Flu illness can vary form mild to severe. While the flue can be serious even in people who are otherwoise healthy, it can be especially dangerous for young children and childrn of any ange who have certain long-term health conditions, including asthma.

What are the symptoms of the flu?

Symptoms of the flu can include fever, cough, sore throat, runny or stuffy nose, body aches, headache, chills, fatigue and sometimes vomiting and diarrhea.

How does the flu spread?

Flu viruses spread mainly by droplets made when people with the flu cough, sneeze or talk. These droplets can land in the mouths or noses of people who are nearby. Less often, a person might get the flu by touching something that has flu virus on it and then touching their own mouth, nose or eyes. People with the flu may be able to infect others from 1 day before getting sick to 5 to 7 days after.

When can my child go back to school?

Keep your child home from school for at least 24 hours after their fever is gone with out medicine.

A fever is defined as 100 F or higher.
