

String of Lights Helping Others

It is an exciting time of year with the holidays just around the corner. Families will be gathering for visits, and of course, great holiday meals. Sadly, more and more people are forgetting the real meaning of Christmas and the holidays. They have instead fallen for the commercialized version which says, "Give me, give me, give me."

To help our students understand the importance of helping others and giving back, we have decided to do a community service project. We are calling it, "A String of Lights." This is going to be a fundraiser to raise money and buy food for families in our community that could use some help during the holidays.

The way it works is as follows:

- Students bring in money to go toward buying food. They can bring this from their own home or ask others to donate to this cause. For each .50 cents that is brought in, the students can place a "light" (paper cutout) on the string in the hallway. They can put their name and class on it.
- 2. The class that raises the most money will get to have a hot chocolate and donut party the week before Christmas break. To help keep track of which class is in the lead, we will have a large paper Christmas tree on the wall in the cafeteria. Each time a class raises \$25.00 we will put a "class bulb" on the tree.
