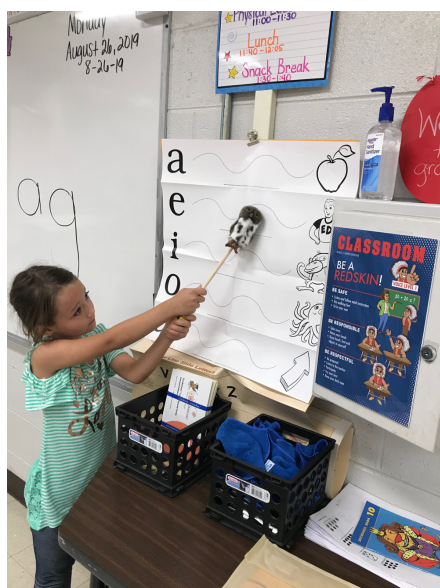

Too Good for Drugs Program



Ms. Caudill's class is participating in *Too Good for Drugs*, a prevention program designed to teach skills for living healthy, drug-free lives. The program will be presented once per week for ten weeks. In the first lesson the children learned that one way to have a great day is to help someone. Studies suggest that children who have opportunities to help or contribute in meaningful ways are less likely to become involved with tobacco, alcohol and other drugs. **Ms. Megan Hudson's Class** will begin the program in January.



Mr. Turner's 6th grade class is also participating in *Too Good for Drugs* prevention program. In their first lesson, they worked on setting reachable goals. The ability to name and set reachable goals builds self-efficacy and a stronger sense of hope for the future. Early exposure to the basic elements of setting and reaching goals enhances the development and application of these skills. Students who can, and do, set reachable goals have a stronger sense of self and make better decisions.



Mrs. Noble's Preschool class enjoyed learning about shapes. Students really got into the lesson by using their own bodies to make the shapes.
